

Exceptional Summer Jobs for Students Available at Oasis

Oasis is hiring summer students this year. The students will help teach people about how Canadians found food over the past 150 years. The teaching will involve hands on activities (e.g., touching tools and foods), interactive games (e.g., identifying foods grown locally in the past) and arts and culture (e.g., paintings, music), for presentation to our community groups including:

- summer children's day camps and recreational and childcare centres,
- seniors groups, and
- cultural associations (e.g., Spanish and Portuguese).

Students will work for eight weeks beginning on July 4th, 2017. Oasis will provide a mentoring role as students develop their skills in English, research, applied computer and communication skills (e.g., internet, social media, public presentations to all ages) and have exposure to compassionate community service. Our funding terms offer priority to students from visible minorities and aboriginal groups and such students are encouraged to apply. Oasis intends to offer a unique summer job experience that will positively change students' lives forever.

Oasis is a community centre that provides food to the Dufferin / Dupont (central-west Toronto) community, provides women's counselling services, operates a Spanish Senior's program, works with volunteers and educates the broader community on food and compassion issues.
